




A large and long prehistoric ditch, dating to the Late Bronze Age to Early Iron Age.






Looking down on a prehistoric watering hole.


An early Roman enclosure cut by a deep well or watering hole, which contained a fragment of structural marble from a nearby building.







The excavation of a Roman oven or kiln, partially cut into a prehistoric ditch.
