## A message from Rev Rachel.

October 2023

#### Dear Friends,

#### What are the tools you need in your job?

At the moment I am going around looking at different primary schools as our daughter starts Reception in September 2024. It's been interesting looking at different schools, and as the teachers present them, it has made me think not just about what the children need to flourish, but what the teachers do too. Because in order for the pupils to reach their potential, the teachers need to enjoy their work, and have the financial, emotional, and academic support that they need too. There are so many pressures put on teachers — as there are in so many sectors, like NHS employees too, where many are at risk of burn out. I'm reminded that the carers need to have their needs met in order that they can care to the best of their ability and do their jobs well.

A shepherd in ancient times had two tools for their task of looking after the sheep. They had a rod, and they had a staff.

The rod was a thicker stick that was used to fight off predators. The staff was a thinner stick with a curved hook, used to rescue sheep that had become stuck somewhere. And if you've ever met a Bishop, a Bishop still carries a staff with them as a symbol of their authority to care for the flock – God's people. The rod and the staff are how the shepherd both protects and guides the sheep. The two sticks had two different purposes. The staff would not be dainty enough to hoick the sheep out of danger. The rod would not be strong enough to wield against a predator

Now I'm guessing an actual rod and an actual staff isn't going to help you very much in your day to day work, fighting off wolves and rescuing lost sheep. But how might we need a spiritual staff and a spiritual rod today? A rod to protect us from the onslaughts of negativity, depression, anxiety and fear, the things that attack us and leave us gasping for breath. A staff to lift us back onto the right path when we're lost, to bring us back into the fold, back into community when we've lost sight of where we're going and tempted to wander off alone.

Psalm 23 says that the rod and the staff, 'they comfort me'. God offers to lead us, with a rod and a staff, so that we might flourish under the divine gaze of love and care, and this is a great comfort.

This month I have been dealing with residents concerns, issues and enquiries. It was also fantastic to meet and chat to residents at the Parish Councils Surgery in October, where I was in attendance with my District Hat on!

I have been happy to attend a few of the Old School Room Working Group meetings. The inaugural committee meeting is being held on 16th November and they are always on the lookout for extra help. So please pop along if

you are interested. The building needs some love and attention and the working group have some fantastic ideas on how to improve the building, to make it a viable concern for the whole community going forward.

BDC are no longer printing and delivering bin collection calendars. But you can find it here <a href="https://www.braintree.gov.uk/bins-waste-recycling/download-collection-calendar">https://www.braintree.gov.uk/bins-waste-recycling/download-collection-calendar</a> if you wish to print it yourself or have it saved on your electronic devices. You will also find reminders in the Parish Council section of the Rayne In Focus.

It is now getting to the time of year when the green bin collection will cease being collected (late November / early December) and if you are interested in having your green bin collected from March 2024, you have until the 30<sup>th</sup> November 2023 to sign up for the early bird offer, to get the service at 50% reduced rate. Calling all businesses & community groups.... The Rural Prosperity Fund is now 'live' at BDC.

The Rural Prosperity Fund supports the aims of the Government's Levelling Up White Paper and Future Farming Programme.

The fund supports capital projects for small businesses and community infrastructure which will improve productivity and strengthen the rural economy and rural communities.

The rural fund provides capital funding to:

- support new and existing rural businesses to develop new products and facilities that will be of wider benefit to the local economy.
- support new and improved community infrastructure, providing essential community services and assets for local people and businesses to benefit the local economy.

Any organisation with legal status within rural areas can get funding. The list includes, but is not limited to:

public sector organisations such as town and parish councils higher and further education institutions small and medium sized businesses voluntary organisations registered charities

Grants between £10,000 and £50,000 are available for the execution of capital projects in rural areas. If you are a business applying for the business grant you must show that you are contributing at least £10,000 to the project. Organisations such as: charities, voluntary organisations or councils will not be required to match funds. #### Wildlife Reports, till October 7<sup>th</sup> 2023

**Phil Monk** Smithsfield 9/9 the air temperature was about 33deg.C, Phil watched two Grass Snakes swimming in his pond. One was about 2.5 ft and the other was about 3ft in length. Phil was unsure of the species, but the size indicates it was probably a Grass Snake which has a yellowish coloured collar below its head. The other native snake in this country is the Adder which is generally smaller up to 2 ft and has a strong zig zag marking down its back. A reliable observer from Great Saling has in the past identified

an Adder near the village but without a picture the experts will not accept the record for this part of Essex. If you meet a snake in the garden, you can identify the Adder by its poisonous bite which needs an urgent appointment at Broomfield hospital while the Grass Snake exudes a foul-smelling liquid from an anal gland which only requires a thorough soaking in a bath to remove. From experience it probably needs two soakings especially if you are visiting friends. The picture shows Sylvia (my wife) rescuing a *Grass Snake* from a house



porch in Rayne. I must not let her proof read this part of the report having given her the snake to carry.

**Chris Turner** Medley Road, 12/9 watched a Hobby catching dragonflies for over 30 minutes near his house. Chris was amazed at the speed the bird reached soon after spotting a meal flying in the distance.

This reminds me of the Hobby we had in our garden several decades ago during the nesting period catching dragonflies over our water. It is a sighting you do not forget. Chris also had 12 Goldfinches on his feeders and was pleased as many of them were young birds. He also spotted a Grey Wagtail on a neighbouring house roof.

Tim Wignall 26/9 Pound Farm Cottage, Shalford Road, continues to see Common Buz-

zards and Red Kites from his cottage. In the stubble field by his cottage 9/9 a Red Leg Partridge with 9 small young about 2 to 3 weeks old. The young will need fine weather so that they can feed well and grow before the winter sets in.

On the same day in the evening two *Muntjac* and a Fallow deer also on a stubble field with a Fallow on the usual field by Pods Lane. The gravel pit digging nearby has not driven all the Fallow away. It is unlikely the numbers will return to



high counts of near 50 recorded before digging started. Tim has also recorded a Kestrel

which is not surprising as the nest box at Goulds just down the road fledged 5 youngsters this year. Adult plumaged Kestrels are seen regularly returning to this nest during the day. Our experience is that the adults regularly visit the nest apparently to retain occupancy until the next breeding season. Tim has also recorded a Red Underwing moth.



**Helen Coney** Shalford Road 30/9 sent the picture of a *Hummingbird Hawk moth* on her Salvias. The picture shows why they carry their very long proboscis coiled up ready to be unfurled when they wish to gather nectar from flowers with a long corolla tube. When looking at Helens picture remember the moths proboscis reaches to the base of the flower where the flower's nectaries, producing nectar are. Its length is equivalent to the length of the moths body.

**Debora Rawlings** Baytree Close and **Phil Monk** 2/10 both sent me pictures of the Jersey Tiger Moth that they have seen. It was reported last month by several residents and I have had several residents comment that they have seen it,.

At Goulds the badgers have dug an area under a group of trees so thoroughly that if it was our vegetable garden, we could plant autumn seeds into the excellent tilth. They were probably looking for worms and other insects. They have dug out a wasp nest in another part of the garden to get to the wasp brood comb. This always surprises me as they must undergo a lot of wasp stings for a small meal. It is said that the Badgers predation of both wasp and bumble bee nests in the ground are most common at this time of the year when the nests are at their largest size and will be the most rewarding. Towards the end August and September, the wasps and hornet roosts will have produced next years queens and these will mate with males (drones) then find a suitable site to hibernate for the winter. All this year's workers will die, and the hibernating queens will find new nest sites in the following spring and make a small nest of honeycomb like cells which then eventually increases in size to several thousand insects. The picture shows a queen Hornet on the cells where she is laying her eggs. In my experience old nest sites are often reused. They often use sites such as holes in the ground, house loft



spaces, tree holes and crevice's, and sometimes hanging free in thick hedges. A thatched roof on a cottage in Rayne has provided a suitable site for wasps in the past but this year a European Hornet has used the thatch for a nest. The Asian Hornet is breeding in this country but has not yet been recorded in Essex. It has decimated bee hives elsewhere in Europe where it kills and eats the bees,



their comb, honey stores and larvae. Both Hornets and Wasps do not have barbs on their stings, so they can withdraw their stings and then sting their victim again until they run out of venom. The Honey Bee unfortunately has barbs on its sting so when it tries to withdraw its sting it also removes its abdomen contents as well which kills it. As bee colonies can contain more than 50,000 bees and like Wasps and Hornets are attracted by scent to any site which has been stung so they can add their venom to the sting site, so the victim cannot rely on a single sting from any of the species.
