## A message from Rev Rachel.

July 2024

#### Dear Friends,

Sometimes our plans are not always best appreciated. As my daughter will be starting school in September, we have spent more time away as a family before school term time begins. In April, we took our first flight as a family to go to France. As the plane was taking off, going at pace down the runway, she turned to me and (very loudly) said 'Mum, can we go on a caravan holiday to West Mersea please?' Out of the mouths of babes! I couldn't believe she had taken that moment to reveal to us, and all the passengers on the plane, that she'd rather be elsewhere. We did end up having a lovely holiday (despite it not being West Mersea) but it was not without its moments!

Holiday times can come with pressures. Perhaps desire for things to be different, people to behave better, weather to improve.... It all to be perfect and look perfect and give us perfect anecdotes. Unmet expectations can easily cause disappointments. Roberts Burns in his poem 'To a mouse' wrote, 'The best laid schemes o' Mice an' Men, Gang aft agley' – things can all so easily go awry, despite our most perfect plans and our best intentions.

It reminds me of an old joke: How do you make God laugh? Tell him your plans. It is challenging when we feel out of control, but control is really an illusion. Christian faith teaches us that God comes to meet us right where we are, in the thick of the reality of our lives – not in our dreams or our expectations. God longs to partner with us in the every day, to guide us to live in a way that is rooted and grounded in love, even in the midst of disappointments. And as we do this, we can become more thankful for what we do have, rather than focusing on what we may lack.

May you have a blessed August whatever you are up to – I think we will end up spending some time down the road in West Mersea!

- Clearing old leaves, twigs, weeds, etc.


In addition they would undertake to send you a photo of the work done.



More than ever, wildlife and their habitats are under threat for survival. The Essex Local Nature Recovery Strategy provides a new vision for our natural spaces and the draft strategy is being prepared for public consultation.

ESSEX LOCAL NATURE RECOVERY STRATEGY

The primary aim of the Essex Local Nature Recovery Strategy is to pinpoint the best locations

for the creation and enhancement of habitats, ensuring the greatest benefits for biodiversity and the wider environment. By outlining key biodiversity priorities and proposed actions, the aim is to achieve a more connected, collaborative approach to nature recovery.

The Essex Local Nature Recovery Strategy draft has been developed in collaboration with farmers, landowners, environmental NGOs, local authorities, members of the public and more. The draft strategy is expected to go to public consultation later this summer.

At the meeting of the Full Council held on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> July 2024, nine councillors were present. District Councillor Ann Hooks was also in attendance. Apologies were received from County Councillor Butland.

Five members of the public were welcomed to the meeting and the matter of parking in Station Road was raised. One issue was that the road has become narrow and vision restricted due to overhanging hedgerow so the Clerk will contact the landowner to see if this can be cut back.

I am writing this monthly report the day after the election, where we saw a huge change in the national political land-scape. The one thing that won't change is that, I am here as your District Councillor and will continue to support and represent you all, here in Rayne village and across the Rayne Ward at a local level.



Because of the 6 weeks of election period, it has been quiet at Braintree District Council, with meetings postponed. However, I have still been busy with resident concerns and emails. I have also attended the PC coffee morning where the Year 6 pupils came along to show us their ecofriendly refill business. It is a fantastic venture and they gave a brilliant presentation. I can personally recommend the products they are selling. Just remember to save your bottles, so you can get a refill next time!

One of the best parts of my role is to provide grants to Rayne Ward organisations. I am happy to inform, that over the past few weeks I have received two applications. One was from the Village Hall, who have received a grant of £350 to use towards the refurbishment of the floor, which will be carried out later



this summer. The other was to the Old School Room Committee, which received £416 to replace the cupboards in the middle (library) room. These have been installed this week and look amazing. The OSR committee are doing a fantastic job in refurbishing the building and I



#### Wildlife Reports, till July 2024

**Tim Wignall** Pound Farm Cottage is a regular contributor to this wildlife report so I asked Tim if he feeds his birds as he is surrounded by arable fields which rarely provide food for wildlife. Tim has 3 feeders with sunflower hearts, two lots of fat balls, puts meal worms on the feeders and feeds peanuts autumn and winter. The Blue and Great Tits are credited with removing bugs from the trees including the apples. No wonder Tim always has a long list of birds frequenting his garden. On 10/6 Tim was rewarded with baby Blue Tits in the garden, he also recorded a Wren, a Buzzard, a pair of Red Leg Partridges and Badger droppings near his cottage.

**Ken Turner** gave us a pot of compost which contained three large larvae. They were very fat and curved in a C shape about 25mm long and whitish in colour, see the pic-

ture. They were either the larvae of a Stag Beetle or Cockchafer Beetle. We believe it was the former, which can grow to 8cms long and are usually found in rotting wood. They are now very scarce, and the larvae were placed back in similar conditions. The adult is one of our largest beetles and its huge antlers shaped like 'stags horns' are used to fight off rivals. It is said that their numbers appear to be stable in this country but have had major declines in Europe. I have only ever seen one live adult beetle which was very impressive.





Beryl Whiteside 21/6 reported Agrimony which has vellow flowers on the footpath from the Street to Duckend Green. Beryl also reminded me of the Pyramidal Orchids that she first reported on the embankment to the Fentons footbridge over the A120 from the Dunmow roundabout. The slip road from the roundabout onto the dual carriage way of the A120 has a greater number of orchids than the footway. If you investigate the slipway banks for the orchids, be careful of the road traffic which is travelling at very high speeds to join the A120. One patch had over 20 flowers. The embankments where the orchids are flowering are not cut and the grass and shrub growth is poor so there is no major competition for the orchids. Hopefully Beryl will continue to monitor this site for the future of the orchids.

Andy Goodey 2/7 saw two Marbled White butterflies, his first for Rayne in the meadow opposite the 47 restaurant. The white butterfly has black markings on its wings which makes it very distinctive. They can be seen feeding on the purple flowers of Field Scabious, Common Knapweed and Wild Marjoram. The caterpillars feed on a variety of grasses. I believe this butterfly has not been recorded in Rayne before.





Phil Monk 2/7 found a Gypsy Moth caterpillar on his Black Currant bush. I am reluctant to ask Phil how good his Black Currants are this year. This caterpillar when it is present in large numbers can strip a large tree of all its foliage in one season. I hope Phil has only one lodger living on his bush.

On 12/7 Phil walked along Pods Brook and saw 6 Yellow Hammers, 2 Little Owls in a dead tree in the field bordering the development at Rayne Gardens, 9 Blackbirds, a Song Thrush, several flying

Sky Larks and also heard an unseen Bullfinch.

I am pleased about the Yellow Hammers which used to be common if one walked the Parish footpaths during the nesting period. It often nests low down or at the base of hedges, and many hedgerows had breeding pairs. Unfortunately, a ground predator has also become more successful in recent years, and this has not helped the birds. Most readers will guess I am referring to the Badger but have no evidence to prove they are guilty. Many readers will claim that us farmers also helped the decline by removing hedgerows in the past.

At Goulds we have four Hares that appear every evening when the farmyard is empty. If not chasing each other they spend their time eating a plant in the mown grass. The Kestrel has fledged at least 3 young. I never checked to see how many of the five eggs hatched.
